# JAY PEAK VERMONT

Located in Vermont's Northern Kingdom, Jay Peak is home to the best powder on the East Coast. The resort lies just south of the Canadian border near the town of Jay, and for 50 years, has been known for its unbelievable terrain, incomparable glades, and abundant natural snowfall. Each year, Jay leads the league in terms of snowfall in Vermont and its plentiful tree runs and groomed terrain make it a generous playground for all visitors. Vermont's only aerial tramway is one of 8 lifts accessing 385 acres of terrain, including 76 trails and 4 terrain parks for skiers and riders of all abilities. Jay's base area supports a healthy ski village atmosphere that features plenty of amenities including a fabulous water park, a cinema, a climbing center, a world-class ice rink, multiple hotel options and more.

At Jay Peak, there's a great mix of beginner to advanced trails connected by a chairlift system and for beginners, they'll love The Zone, Jay Peak's learning area which includes 80 acres of wide, gentle, easy to maneuver trails and introductory glades - the most beginner and intermediate tree skiing in the East! The ski area also contains a large snow making infrastructure able to cover a majority of the resort.

**SKI AREA BOUNDARY POLICY**

- Know where the Ski Area Boundary is, and ski or ride on open trails and glades within the boundary.
- You can be charged for any rescue which takes place on any open glades or trails.
- Rescue and ambulance services require the Ski Area Boundary to be maintained for public use by Jay Peak Resort.
- Do not leave the Ski Area Boundary unless you are prepared for wilderness travel.
- Pass the Ski Area Boundary, there is no way back to the Jay Peak Resort Base Area. When you pass beyond the Ski Area Boundary you leave the area of Ski Patrol Services. You are responsible for your own actions, your own rescue and the cost of your rescue.

**WOODS SKIING POLICY**

- Glades are marked trails that are opened and closed by ski patrol.
- Woods are in certain sections of forest that are not marked on the map and are not opened or closed by Ski Patrol.
- Woods are recommended for 2000FT+ elevations of 20 or more, please do not venture after you.
- Woods skiers must enter and exit from an open trail and cannot ski under or around traffic controlling ropes or fences.

**OUT OF BOUNDS:** Going out of bounds beyond the dashed yellow and orange lines can lead you away from the mountain and will result in a long, difficult hike to a remote road.

**UPHILL TRAVEL:** Jay Peak allows skinning, snowshoeing, and hiking during operating hours on designated Uphill Travel Routes on open terrain. Cost: \$50 for an annual pass.

**This is a specialized winter sports education week.** All trips include 6-nights lodging, 5-day lift pass, 5-day rentals, 5-hours of group lessons for pupils daily x 5-days, transportation, breakfasts and dinners. **Groups must arrive on Sunday and depart the resort just after skiing on Friday. Most groups spend the night en route to their departure airport, have free time to explore the city and then fly home on Saturday. Another option is to depart New England immediately after skiing on Friday if airline/transport times permit this.** As we get very specialized pricing, ski resort package alterations are not allowed.

- ARRIVAL AIRPORT:** Boston (MA), Manchester (NH), Burlington (VT) or Montreal (QC)
- TRANSPORT:** Motorcoach transportation is provided to & from the resort plus the accommodation on departure. Coaches do not stay at the resort during your ski week as it is not needed.
- INSTRUCTION SIZE:** General clinics are 10-12 pupils of similar ski ability level (beginner, intermediate, advanced). Snowboarders must have a minimum of 8 of similar ability to comprise an instruction group. At times, boarders may be mixed with ski groups or included in general adult/family clinics. This is not guaranteed until arrival though, so pupils may be asked to switch to a ski instruction package.
- EQUIPMENT RENTAL:** Ski fit is done on-mountain; helmets are included. Ski fit will take place either on initial arrival at the resort or prior to the first morning's lessons, based on availability. Because our package is bundled, if anyone brings their own equipment, package discounts are unavailable.
- LODGING:** Groups will have accommodation for 5-nights at the ski resort plus 1-night at a hotel prior to departure. Lodging options include Stateside Hotel & Hotel Jay. [The Stateside Hotel](#), our top pick for education groups, is a ski-in/out property and features rooms with either 2 queen beds OR 1 king bed and 1 pull-out sofa sleeper, both types sleeping 4 students. Staff use identical rooms to sleep 2 staff members. This property has its own dedicated base lodge and features its own restaurant. All rooming must be maximized with bedding places or additional fees are assessed. [The Hotel Jay](#) is located at the main resort and is an upscale property featuring several different types of guest rooms with different occupancy limits. Meals are generally taken in the conference center areas. **IMPORTANT:** A credit card deposit is required for each room at check-in. This is generally held and then released after your departure.
- RESORT TRANSPORT:** Jay Peak offers complimentary transportation around the resort via shuttle.
- CONVENIENCE:** The resort offers a Provisions General Store for supplies, food, snacks and resort logo wear. The resort also offers numerous additional gift shops with everything from swimwear to skiwear.
- MEALS:** Daily breakfasts and dinners are included in your package. Meals are generally served buffet-style and students and staff may help themselves as needed. For groups arriving in resort after 8 PM, a boxed sandwich will be available in place of a full meal. If multiple student groups are in house, they may be grouped together for meal purposes. Lunches are purchased on own, paid for independently in the base lodge or a number of restaurants. A suggested lunch budget is \$20 USD pp.
- EVENING ACTIVITIES:** As part of the Jay Peak package, groups will have two days included at the [Pump Haus Indoor Waterpark](#). Additional activities included are [Clips & Reels Climbing & Ropes](#), and a movie night. The Ice Haus is also available for ice hockey games, curling and ice skating at additional cost.
- RESORT DEPARTURE:** On the final day in resort, groups will be required to check-out of their hotel rooms prior to skiing. Luggage will be stored in a specified area while the group is skiing. Immediately following ski clinics, groups will gather their luggage, board their coach and prepare for their return journey. Resort activities are generally completed by 3 PM, allowing for group departure by 4 PM. If groups are traveling to Boston, Manchester,

Burlington or Montreal, they will have a basic pizza dinner included when they arrive at their hotel.

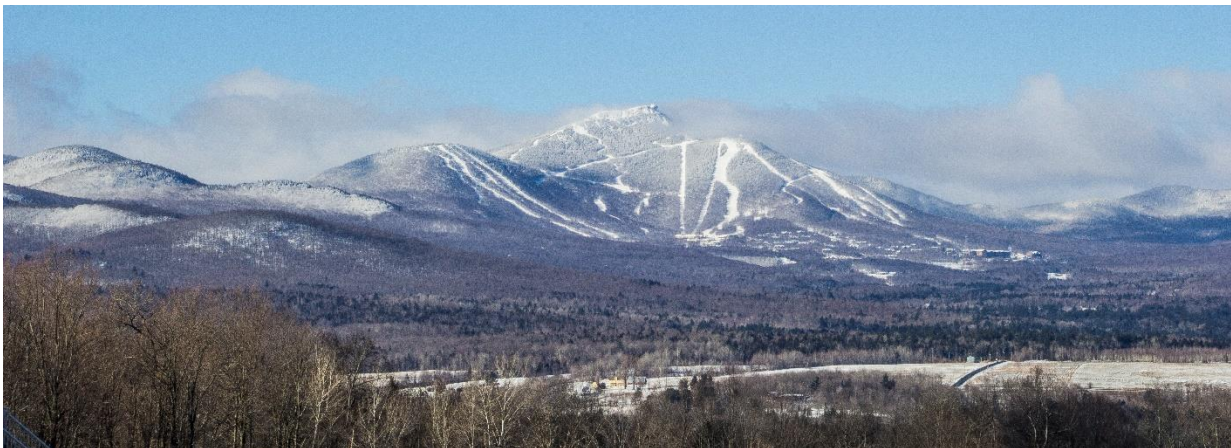
**INSURANCE:** All groups are required to carry travel insurance. If you are a USA-based school, this is available for purchase during registration if desired.

**WAIVERS:** Waivers are required for the ski resort, equipment rental and some activities. Waivers are not negotiable. If unsigned, the participant will not be allowed to take part in activities. Waivers must be signed by the parent or legal guardian for any persons under the age of 18.

**RATES:** All quotes are costed in USD and dates available include January through April, based on availability. **Please understand that groups falling over MLK and President's Week are not available.** Rates are based solely on arriving in the resort on a Sunday and departing after skiing on Friday. If numbers change once booked, this will affect your pricing and discounts applied to staff. Please ensure that if there is a change, you let us know at your earliest convenience so we may reconfigure rates to best protect you.

**Gratuities:** As service positions earn their personal income from gratuities, it is customary for the group to tip their Ambassador and Ski Instructors. A standard gratuity is \$25 per person for Ambassadors and \$20 - \$30 for the 5-day span for Instructors. Gratuities are usually distributed at the end of the ski week. Additionally, please advise your groups on appropriate tipping of waitstaff for any meal services that are not included in your itinerary such as lunches, if eating at restaurant where you are served.

**Minimum Booking Numbers:** 20 students

**What's Included:**

- Round-trip flights or motorcoach transport
- Airport transfers & motorcoach transportation to/from resort
- 6-nights' accommodation (5-nights Jay + 1-night city break)
- Breakfasts & dinners daily starting with dinner on your night of arrival and ending with breakfast on your day of departure (dependent upon transfer time required for flights)

**What's Not Included:**

- Ice Haus activities; available at extra cost
- Lunches, snacks and beverages other than at meal times
- Cost of passports nor required visas
- Cost of inoculations or medication required for travel
- Sightseeing / Entertainment options not shown as included
- Hotel incidental deposits & bills – meals, mini-bar items, recreation charges, purchases billed to room, etc.
- Any gratuities – drivers, hotel services, ambassador, ski instructors, local guides
- Credit card fees if individuals wish to pay via credit card instead of ACH
