Day 1

Dinner



Travel to Costa Rica via air, arriving at Juan Santamaría International Airport. After boarding your transportation, your group will be swiftly transferred to your hotel. After getting checked in, we will have our Welcome, Safety & Orientation meeting and then dependent upon your arrival time, your group will reconvene for dinner later in the evening. If you experience a late arrival, head for bed and we will start in the morning!

Sample Hotel: Best Western Irazú Hotel - This full-service San Jose hotel provides comfortable lodging and superb customer service. The hotel is centrally located in the capital city, near major attractions, commercial and banking districts and only 15 minutes away from San José International Airport. Hotel amenities include 3 hotel restaurants and room service options, buffet breakfast, free wireless Internet, outdoor swimming pool, fitness facilities, gift shop, business center, laundromat, 24-hour front desk with currency exchange, plus a casino (adults only). Room amenities include wireless internet telephone service, hairdryers, safe deposit boxes, 32-inch LCD TV, coffee makers with Costa Rican coffee, and air conditioning.



Day 2

Breakfast, lunch & dinner

Today we'll get a taste of stunning Costa Rica by visiting the world-renown Doka Estate & Coffee Plantation followed by a trip to La Paz Waterfall Gardens & Nature Park along with an environmental program to understand why Costa Rica is the top country in the world for incredible eco-tourism.

The Doka Estate Coffee Tour - Located in the coffee capital of Costa Rica, this coffee plantation belongs to the Costa Rican Vargas Ruiz family; pioneers and award winners of coffee production for more than 70 years. The tour takes place on the Doka Estate, where students learn about production, harvesting, the processing plant and the roasting of the coffee grain. Costa Rica has a large variety of microclimates and altitudes within short distances. The route taken explains how the different climatic factors flavor the taste of the coffee. Guided by



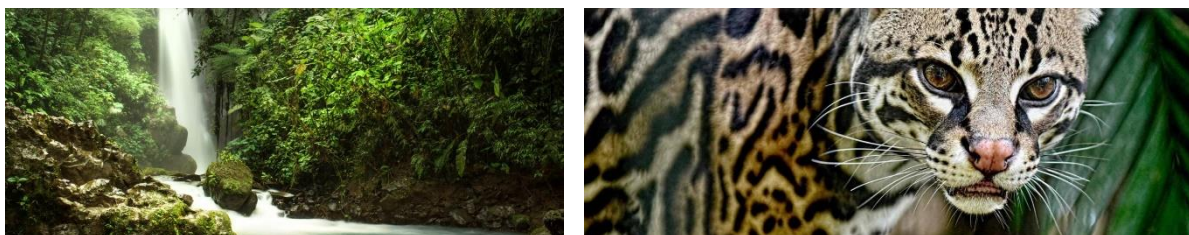

an expert, students will receive extensive information making this activity an incomparable experience. And best yet, we'll 'taste' the process along the way!



La Paz Waterfall Gardens & Nature Park - La Paz Waterfall Gardens Nature Park is an ecological attraction featuring stunning waterfalls, an animal sanctuary with over 100 species, and cloud and rainforest hiking trails. See the waterfalls, jaguars, pumas, sloths, monkeys, hummingbirds, snakes, frogs and a lot more!



In the late afternoon, we'll get ready for our first performance, and this is a big one!

National Stadium Performance - Your group will have a performance for the game opening, a half-time presentation show, plus an extra presentation at the end of the game, upon request. The audience is expected to be very, very large. Dependent upon dates booked, this opportunity will most likely fall on a Thursday as these are when the soccer games are played in Costa Rica. Soccer is the top sport in the country.

Day 3

Breakfast, lunch & dinner

Put on your hiking boots this morning because we're off on a Volcano Tour!

Poás Volcano - Poás volcano is a powerful symbol of the geothermal forces that formed Costa Rica. When the mist and clouds part you'll see the sulfuric, bubbling, green rain-fed lake at the bottom, surrounded by smoke and steam rising from fumaroles. Water from the lake is constantly seeping through cracks in the hot rock, evaporating and building pockets of steam. When the pressure in these pockets exceeds the weight of the water above, the steam breaks through in geysers that rocket up to 820 feet (250 meters) high. Don't worry about getting a shower though, the crater is 1,050 feet (320 meters) deep. At almost a mile across it's also the largest active crater in the world. A modern visitors' center and small museum explains and interprets the geothermal and ecological attractions in the park.



In the afternoon, we'll visit and perform for a local school or university.

University or School Performance - The performance opportunities include San Luis Gonzaga High School (the first high school in Costa Rica), Methodista High School (one of largest private schools in the country) or Costa Rica University which will be showcased as a coordinated presentation with their Arts School (which houses the official dance group from the University). Visiting groups may select which opportunities they prefer for first chance at scheduling.

Day 4

Breakfast, lunch & dinner

Today is a day for rest, relaxation and fun! We'll start by visiting the Sarchi Artisans, home to Costa Rica's most famous craft center.

Sarchi - Surrounded by rolling green hills lined with coffee plantations, Sarchi is the premiere destination in Costa Rica for souvenirs. This area is home to the highest population of artisans, crafters and wood workers in the country. There are over 200 such shops in this small pueblo!

In the afternoon, sit back and relax as you watch the stunning scenery glide by, taking you to the area of Arenal and La Fortuna. Once one of the top ten most active volcanoes in the world, the Arenal Volcano fell into dormancy in 2010 giving us a beautiful, worry-free spot to rest our souls. After checking into our hotel, we'll have a brilliant evening soaking in the amazing hot springs at Baldi with an onsite dinner.

Sample Hotel: Magic Mountain Hotel – The Magic Mountain Hotel is located at the base of the Arenal Volcano and consists of 36 standard-sized rooms, all with a balcony or terrace view of Arenal Volcano. The rooms are tastefully decorated, close to the swimming pool area, and include two queen-sized beds, private baths, air conditioning, ceramic tile floors, telephone, refrigerator, cable television, safety box, coffee maker, hair dryer and wireless internet service. Resort amenities include a spa, swimming pool, restaurant and sports bar.

Baldi Hot Springs – Get ready for a great evening! Baldi Hot Springs provides 25 of the most thermal mineral water pools in the world flowing naturally from the volcano. Their medicinal waters have delightful settings for each individual taste of heat with temperatures ranging from 32 – 67oC. The unique pools are surrounded by lush vegetation where delicious waterfalls massage your back. Changing rooms, water slides, swim-up bars and Roman bath pools are sure to whet your appetite.



Day 5

Breakfast, lunch & dinner

This morning we'll set off for adventure!

Sky-Trek Ziplines - Get your heart pounding by taking a zipline ride through the rainforest canopy; whizz along cables slung between canyons, admire incredible views, fly over and in between trees to feel an adrenaline rush like no other. You'll soar through the rainforest with an unbelievable view!



In the afternoon, we'll embark on our next performance in Fortuna.

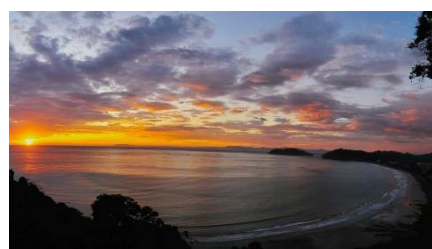

Jaco - We'll arrive in Jaco in the afternoon with plenty of time for beach fun. Jaco is the most popular beach town in Costa Rica and its lively town center offers unique shops and galleries giving Jaco its fantastic character. Day 7

Good morning Pacific Coast! After breakfast, we'll travel to the beautiful Manuel Antonio State Park for a morning of exploration!

Manuel Antonio National Park - With the establishment of Manuel Antonio National Park in 1972, the people of Costa Rica decided to preserve one of the most beautiful and bio-diverse areas in the world. Although it is the country's smallest national park, the stunning beauty and diversity of wildlife in its 683 hectares is unequalled. Manuel Antonio contains a charming combination of rainforest, beach and coral reefs. These beaches are the most beautiful in the country, lined with lush forest, and the snorkeling is excellent too. **The forest is home for sloths, iguanas, monkeys and millions of colorful crabs.**



After our guided park visit, we'll head out for a quick change and our fourth and final performance!

Central Pacific Performance - This presentation will be coordinated with the Puntarenas Municipality for a presentation at Puntarenas Amphitheatre. For this presentation, we always coordinate **sunset performances** because the location is seafont, and the photography images are spectacular.

Optional Dance Master Classes

Please let us know if you would like any of these options added into your itinerary while visiting Costa Rica. We will be happy to determine additional costs and itinerary placement for your approval.

Salsa Dance - Salsa is a syncretic dance form with origins from Cuba as the original American meeting point of European and African cultures. The current method of Salsa dancing contains movement elements from a variety of dance genres including traditional Mambo, Guaguanco, Swing and Hustle. Salsa is normally a partner dance although there are recognized solo forms such as line dancing suelta and Rueda de Casino where multiple couples exchange partners in a circle. Salsa can be improvised or performed with a set routine.

Merengue Dance - Merengue is a style of Latin American music and dance with a two-step beat. Merengue was made the official music and dance of the Dominican Republic by Rafael Trujillo. Some say merengue derived from the 'paso de la empalizada' (pole-fence step). There are also legends about a limping war hero (or in some version, El Presidente of a banana republic himself) who had to step in this way while dancing because of wounds, and the polite public imitated him. Although the tempo of the music may be frantic, the upper body is kept majestic and turns are slow, typically four beats/steps per complete turn. In some regions, the 'empalizada' style is replaced by the exaggerated Cuban motion taught in ballroom studios.

Cumbia Dance - Cumbia is a Latin American musical style that originated in Colombia's Caribbean region. Traditional Cumbia and its associated dance is considered to be representative of Columbia, along with Vallenato, Bambuco and Pasillo. Cumbia originated from the Caribbean coast of eastern Colombia, with folkloric variants in Panama from where it spread gaining particular popularity in Mexico, Argentina, and the Andean region. Cumbia began as a courtship dance practiced among the African slave population that was later mixed with European instruments and musical characteristics.

Many items are priced in USD and not in Colons. Enquire about currency markings prior to purchase.

- Females may desire to bring dresses for dinner although not required
- Cash for meals on travel days
- Cash for any Gratuities
- Gifts for local school children if desired (for joint dance performances)

PASSPORT COPY - Please bring at least one photocopy of your passport's information page. In case of the loss of a passport, the passport owner can use this copy to get a new passport reissued relatively quickly. Additionally, participants may be asked to show proof of nationality to authorities so this should be carried on your person always.

GRATUITY SUGGESTION:

Please know that gratuities are totally discretionary however they are customary and assist in making up the general basic wages for service personnel. Gratuities are usually paid in USD, per person and suggested minimums shown are **per day of service, per person on tour**, for each of the following positions - bus driver (\$2), Costa Rica National Guide (\$4) & Tour Ambassador (\$5). Please budget \$11 a day x 8 days = \$88 per person for an average tip with “good” service.
